2.2 Individual Event Schedule

All Mini Wheelers must check in at the registration before 5:30 pm. Sprockets must check in at the registration hut before 6:45 pm.

Novice, Challenge Class riders and Masters check in at the transponder "self-check-in station" at the start hill's entrance. All riders must be registered by 6:45 pm.

3 EVENT ENTRIES

3.1 Event Categories

The Jingili Triple Series will run the categories below. At least three (3) riders must be registered in each category for it to be held.

Novice is a participation race class. To be eligible for Novice, riders must have joined AusCycling within the last 12 months. New riders aged 8-12 can choose between Novice or Challenge Class but cannot race both.

Sprockets (Non-Gate Starting)	No Gender Division	2-7
Sprockets	No Gender Division	5 and Under, 6, 7
Novice	No Gender Division	8-12
Challenge (Standard 20")	Male & Female	8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13-15, 16-24
Masters (20" or 24")	Male & Female	25+

3.2 Entry Process and Cost

Mini Wheelers and Sprockets have a set fee for the series and will only need to enter once. Entries must be completed by 10 am on Friday, the 10th of May. Riders entering after this date may receive a different award.

Novice, Challenge, and Masters riders can enter each round individually on the day or enter the entire series before the first round for a \$10 discount. Series entries must be completed by 10 am on Friday, May 10th, via EntryBoss, eftpos at the club, or an NT School Sport Voucher. Riders wishing to enter each round individually can do this at the club on the day of racing.

Entries will be uploaded into Sqorz after they have closed. It is the rider's/rider's guardian's responsibility to ensure that their entry is correct, including the transponder number, category, and plate number.

The cost of entry will be:

Category	Entry Fees (inc GST) (+ transaction cost)			
Mini Wheelers	\$35 (This fee is for the full series and only needs to be paid once)			
Sprockets	\$35 (This fee is for the full series and only needs to be paid once)			
Novice or Challenge (Standard 20")	\$50 for a series entry or \$20 per round			
Masters (20" or 24")	\$50 for a series entry or \$20 per round			

3.3 Membership

The events will be open to all riders holding an AusCycling "All Discipline - 4 Week Free Trial", Race All Discipline Membership or Race Off-Road Membership.

3.4 Transponders

- All riders (except Mini Wheelers and Sprockets) must provide their own transponder to enter this event.
- It is the rider's responsibility to ensure that the transponder is correctly fitted to their bike and operational, including an active <u>subscription</u>.
- Transponders can be purchased from Jingili BMX Club for \$75; this includes one (1) year's subscription.

3.5 Race Plates

- Riders must ensure they have the correct Race Plate as detailed under section 3.02 of the <u>AusCycling</u> <u>Technical Regulations – BMX</u>.
- Riders with duplicate plates in the same category may be required to add an 'X' to their race number.
- Race plates can be purchased from Jingili BMX Club for \$20.

3.6 Event Registration (Sign On)

- All riders are required to attend the Event Registration (sign-on).
- Parents and guardians of Mini Wheelers and Sprockets must check in at the registration hut, which is located next to the canteen.
- All Masters, Novice, and Challenge Class riders must register for the event by taking their bikes to the transponder checking station.

4 RACE INFORMATION

4.1 Rules and Regulations

The event will be conducted under the Technical Regulations of AusCycling Australia (AC) and the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI).

These Technical Regulations are supplementary to the following:

- AusCycling Technical Regulations General
- <u>AusCycling Technical Regulations BMX</u>

4.2 Race Format

Current UCI Rules apply using Scrambled Moto transfer system for all categories except for participation. Block format may apply pending rider entries. Gate positions for Motos will be random computer drawn. Total points to end of motos followed by Qualifiers and Finals. Gate positions for Qualifiers and Finals are in order of lap time from the previous Stage or Round.

A category of one (1) full gate or less (i.e. eight (8) riders or less riders) will be run in accordance with section 2.03.03 a) of the <u>AusCycling Technical Regulations – BMX</u>.

The race format for the Jingili Triple Series is as follows:

Category	Race Format
Mini Wheelers	30 minutes of track time
Sprockets	4 Motos
Novice, Challenge Class, Masters	4 Motos, Qualifiers, Finals

5 SERIES QUALIFICATION AND POINTS

5.1 Series Qualification

The minimum qualification for the Jingili Triple Series for Novice, Masters and Challenge Class riders is two (2) of the three (3) rounds.

Sprockets and Mini Wheelers can attend at least one (1) of the three (3) rounds.

5.2 Series Points

The Jingili Triple Series points will be awarded based on the overall finishing place within each round, per the table below:

5.3 Points Calculation

Jingili Triple Series points will be calculated by adding the highest attained points from each round, based on the overall finishing place (rank) within each round.

The maximum number of rounds where points can be used for the series calculation equals the number of rounds used for qualification. For clarity, the maximum number of rounds for the Jingili Triple Series is two (2).

Points are awarded and calculated by category:

• For example, if a rider enters 11 Boys in one event and 12 Boys in the next, both results will earn points in different categories. Points earned in different categories will not be added together for placing.

5.4 Riding Up

Riders are permitted to ride up per the <u>AusCycling Technical Regulations</u> 2.01:

- 2.01.01 Except at National Championships, National Series and State/Territory Championships, competitors may only enter up (ride up) two (2) categories above their racing age or ride the opposite gender category equal to or above (but not below) their own racing age. This includes age-on-day and year of birth racing.
- 2.01.02 A competitor in all categories other than participation categories (Novice, Sprockets and Mini Wheelers) may enter up two (2) categories above their racing age up to the pinnacle category.

Pinnacle category is the category with a maximum age of 24, categories above the age of 24 shall be combined with the next younger category. Riders aged above 24 may enter down (ride down) to the pinnacle category. E.g 50+ rider can enter 16-24.

Participation categories are permitted to ride up within their category only. (e.g. Sprockets must stay in Sprockets).

5.5 Merged Categories

In the scenario where categories have been merged at an event (for whatever reason), points will be awarded to the rider according to their entered category. For example, if a rider is merged into a category and is placed third in that category but is the first finisher in their entered age category, they will receive first-place points.

5.6 Tie Break

When competitors share the same number of Series Total points, ties will be broken using the following method:

- 1. The competitor with the highest number of points earned in a single event that counts towards their series total is awarded the better rank.
- 2. If the scores are still tied, the next highest points for each rider are compared, and so on, until all events that contribute to their series total are exhausted.
- 3. If still tied, the riders will receive the same series placing.

6 AWARDS & PRIZING

6.1 Mini Wheelers and Sprockets

All Mini Wheelers and Sprockets will receive a trophy for their participation.

6.2 Novice

Riders who complete two or more rounds in Novice will receive a medallion for their participation.

6.3 Challenge Class and Masters

For Challenge Class and Masters categories, the following will be provided:

Please Note: Merged Category payouts will be in accordance with UCI Part 6 Technical Regulations 6.1.014.

6.4 DISTRIBUTION OF AWARDS / PRIZE MONEY

All awards and prizes will be presented at the third round of the series on Friday, May 24th.

- Mini Wheelers, after their allocated track time at approx. 6:25 pm
- Sprockets, after their final moto /during the break
- Novice, Challenge and Masters, after finals/last motos

Riders who are eligible for an award but don't attend the series' final round will need to contact Jingili BMX Club via Facebook to make alternative arrangements for the collection of their award.

7 VENUE INFORMATION

The following are prohibited at Jingili BMX Club:

- Smoking (including E-Cigarettes or other vaping devices), please use the smoking area located outside of the venue
- Alcohol
- Pets

All Jingili BMX Club attendees must adhere to the <u>AusCycling Code of Conduct</u>. Failure to do so or to follow any reasonable direction provided by Jingili BMX Club or appointed officials at the event may result in removal from the venue or exclusion from the competition.
